Dear Parents!

Greetings!

We are thankful for God's Grace and appreciate the efforts of the Kingdom of Bahrain against the spread of COVID-19. The school management appreciates the tremendous support from the school's teaching faculty, students, and parents to proceed and complete the second term successfully.

The third term will begin on Monday, the fourth day of January 2022, after the declaration of results from 28th December 2021.

As a precautionary measure, Bahrain's National Medical Task Force has announced that Bahrain will move to the Yellow Alert Level from 19th December 2021 to 31st January 2022. Therefore, the school management has decided to continue the hybrid learning approach following the Yellow Alert Level in the third term, in which 50% attendance is allowed.

The school's computerized system has divided each class strength into two groups. Group A will attend school on Sundays and Wednesdays, while Group B will attend school on Mondays and Thursdays. The students at home will have the provision to attend the online classes. Tuesdays will be remote learning days for all students. However, Tuesdays may be used as "Lab Days" for senior classes following "Yellow Alert Level" SOPs.

It is important to note that there will be no change in the evaluation policy for exceptional circumstances for all classes. However, if circumstances permit, students of grades 9, 10, 11, and 12 will be encouraged to sit in in-person prelim exams.

Please note that the school will follow all the "Yellow Alert Level" guidelines and SOPs as mentioned in the earlier letter posted on 8th September 2021. In all circumstances, everyone who works or visits school will strictly follow the rules and regulations instructed by the Ministry of Education, Bahrain.

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The school will update the parents for any amendments or adjustments in the evaluation policy or other school-related academic matters.

Thanks for the commendable cooperation the school receives from you, with this cooperation, the school implements its plans effectively.
