Sub: Re-opening of school for in-person activities

Dear Parents!

Greetings!

The Kingdom of Bahrain has adopted the GREEN LEVEL alert from today, 15th February 2022, allowing a return of 100% capacity for indoor activities.

Therefore, the school management has decided to reopen the school facility for in-person teaching-learning activities from Sunday, 20th February 2022. All the students of Senior, Middle and Primary sections are advised to come to school to receive educational instructions except those who have flu, cough, fever, or other related COVID symptoms.

However, the parents have the option to send their ward(s) to school or keep them home for online teaching – learning activities.

The school will continue to provide educational instructions using in-person and online platforms to minimize the chances of missing the daily Teaching-Learning activities provided by the school.

The parents will be informed in advance of any changes according to the traffic light alert or any other advice from MOE & MOH Bahrain

The National Medical Taskforce:

In line with what has been previously announced on 31 January, the Kingdom of Bahrain will adopt the Green Alert Level starting from 15 February 2022

in accordance with the COVID-19 Alert Level Traffic Light System

Some procedures within the Green Alert Level have been updated:



A return to 100% capacity for all indoor facilities, including cinemas, playgrounds, entertainment centres, events, conference halls, and public attendance at sports events, **individuals would not need to present a Green Shield vaccine pass. Masks wearing indoors will continue to be compulsory**






There is no increase in the number of cases that require medical treatment or are in intensive care



This is due to the success of the Kingdom's National Vaccination Campaign




The Kingdom continues its preparedness, including maintaining medical capacities across its testing, isolation and treatment centres, to address any further challenges that may arise or pandemic developments that may occur

Green level

If the rolling average of positive cases in intensive care units is 50 or less for 14 days.
